B: Last week we lit the candle of Wisdom as we prayed for our faith to be strengthened.

C: This week we light the Key of David candle as we long for freedom and for hope to be reborn.

D: "O Key of David, and scepter of the House of Israel, which opens what none may lock, and locks what none may open: come and convey us prisoners out of dungeon cells, we who dwell in darkness, and the shadow of death."

*The purple candle from last week and another purple candle are lit while a soloist sings verse 5 of #211: "O come, thou Key of David, come, and open wide our heavenly home. The captives from their prison free, and conquer death's deep misery. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel."*

Isaiah 22:22:

"I will place on his shoulder the key of the house of David; he shall open and no one shall shut; he shall shut, and no one shall open."

42:5-9:

"Thus says God who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people upon it and spirit to those who walk in it: 'I am God, I have called you in righteousness, I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.
